

## **Rare Original Colt Automatic Gun/Digger Drawings**

The famous gun used in the Spanish American war of 1898 between the United States and Spain. The new Colt automatic Gun /Digger purchased by Sergeant William Tiffany and used in Teddy Roosevelt's regiment of rough riders supporting the charge up San Juan hill.

These are very rare original Colt factory drawings of the first Colt automatic machine gun known as the digger. These 6 drawings were made as the only original Colt drawings to represent this rare gun and its internals, demonstrating its workings.

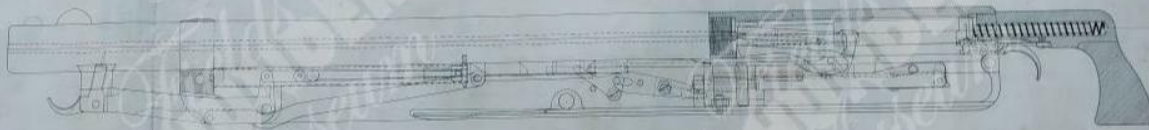
These original drawings from the Colt Company were made of drafting linen cloth, a very durable material which has long been discontinued in the drafting world. The drawings have dates ranging from the early conception of the gun in 1893 to 1900 showing a complete view on its tripod and the drawing sizes ranges as follows.

A-55-3 (44" x 15")    A-41 (36" x 22")    A-57-3 (44" x 14 5/8")  
( 44" x 14" 5/8 )        ( 31" x 12" )

These are the only original drawings that show the first automatic gun in a full profile view, on its tripod, accompanied with 5 additional drawings, 4 of which are full scale transparent views. These drawing views show in great detail the guns internal working parts, including numbering them. The 6<sup>th</sup> drawing of the group is showing a side view of the gun on its carriage and limber arrangement, also in great detail.

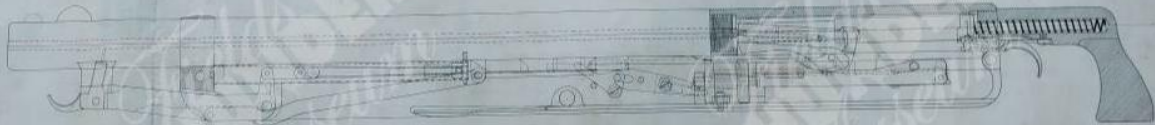
